### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO MEDICAL CANNABIS DAY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that on June 14, 2000,
- 2 Governor Cayetano signed Hawaii's Medical Use Cannabis Act into
- 3 law, which authorized qualifying patients to engage in the
- 4 personal medical use of cannabis under the supervision of a
- 5 physician.
- 6 The legislature further finds that June 14 is a significant
- 7 day for the State and its medical cannabis patients because this
- 8 event marked the first time that a state authorized the medical
- 9 use of cannabis by means of the legislative process. The
- 10 significance of this day was recognized by proclamation by the
- 11 mayors of all four counties in 2020 and 2021 and by the governor
- 12 in 2021.
- 13 The purpose of this Act is to establish June 14 of each
- 14 year as medical cannabis day in recognition of the State's
- 15 authority over the intra-state regulation of cannabis and in
- 16 honor of Hawaii's growing number of patients who are finding
- 17 relief through the medical use of cannabis.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended
2	by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to
3	read as follows:
4	"§8- Medical cannabis day. June 14 of each year shall
5	be known and designated as "Medical Cannabis Day" to commemorate
6	the state authorized medical use of cannabis in Hawaii and to
7	honor the growing number of qualifying patients who are finding
8	relief through the medical use of cannabis. This day is not and
9	shall not be construed as a state holiday."
10	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2022.
