

Governor Ben Cayetano

Senate Bill 862 Act 228 HRS 329, Part IX

Signed into law: June 14, 2000

Went into effect: December 28, 2000

Never consulting with DOJ/DEA about creating a state authorized medical cannabis program.

Figured the DEA would say no so why bother asking (personal communication).

Maybe thought that lack of legal action from DOJ meant tacit approval.

Medical Cannabis Program

Grow Your Own model.

No provisions for seeds or cuttings.

7 plants: 3 flowering, 4 immature.

3 ounces of usable material.

2013: SB642

4 ounces7 plants any maturity

HB668

Move from NED to DOH Effective Jan 1, 2015



2015: HB321

State-licensed dispensary program
Vertical monopoly model based on diversion
8 licensees

Medical Cannabis Program

2022: Still just 8 licensees across four islands
Continuing Criminal Enterprises
No regular banking services
Unable to deduct business expense
70% tax burden



34K+ registered patients (<u>DOH – May 2022</u>)

Must violate federal law to participate

Slew of negative consequences

Not prevented by Rohrabacher-Farr rider

HCR132 (SLH 2021)

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO APPLY TO THE DRUG ENFORCEMENT ADMINISTRATION'S OFFICE OF DIVERSION CONTROL FOR AN EXCEPTION UNDER TITLE 21 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS SECTION 1307.03, AND REQUEST FORMAL WRITTEN ACKNOWLEDGMENT THAT THE LISTING OF MARIHUANA, MARIHUANA EXTRACT, AND TETRAHYDROCANNABINOLS AS CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES IN FEDERAL SCHEDULE I DOES NOT APPLY TO THE PROTECTED ACTIVITIES IN HAWAII REVISED STATUTES.
